Stories say that leprechauns mend shoes for other fairies and hide gold coins at the end of rainbows. They are grumpy, mean and best known for their trickery. The leprechaun has been associated with Irish culture for centuries, longer than St. Patrick's Day itself. The mythical creatures became a symbol of the holiday in the mid 1900s when St. Patrick's Day celebrations became more popular in the United States. Leprechauns are also a symbol of luck.
